Partnerships

- ❖ Charles R Drew University of Medicine and Science: On October 14, a team from West including Bob Sprague, Ara Aguiar, Kathy Walton, Carmen Dones, and Carlos Sermeno visited CRD to sign a memo of understanding to work together to create pathways from West to CRD.
- ❖ Bridge to the Baccalaureate Planning Grant Application: West is working with CSUDH to develop a planning grant proposal that will allow 18 months of funding to build a competitive plan for a full B2B proposal. We hope to involve the Computer Science, Mathematics, and Science divisions.
- ❖ Department of State Community College Initiative: West is joining Harbor, Trade, and City to develop a proposal that will bring 36 international students to the four colleges for one year of study and exposure to many aspects of American culture.
- ❖ Study Abroad: Currently there are 10 students in each of the 4 courses. Financial Aid can and is playing a large role in helping to finance students.
- ❖ Global Studies and International Area Studies (Africa, Asia, Latin America, Middle East) degree programs have been approved by Curriculum and Senate.

Submissions

- ❖ Community College Pathway to Law School Initiative from the State Bar of California and California LAW, a 501c3. The Law School Initiative will connect, communicate, collaborate, and coordinate the programs that are part of the educational pipeline for developing and assisting diverse students seeking careers in the legal profession or law-related careers. It consists of 14 high school law academies created under the California Partnership Academy model in a unique partnership between the State Bar of California and the California Department of Education. Additionally, it includes members of the *Community College Pathway to Law School* initiative with 24 community colleges throughout the state, six undergraduate institutions and six law schools resulting in an educational pipeline into the legal profession created under the leadership of the State Bar of California's Council on Access and Fairness.
