Call to order. M. Pracher called the meeting to order at 1:05 p.m.

- Draft minutes of 9-23-15.** The draft minutes of 9-23-15 were reviewed. K. Considine and L. Peterson will be added as attendees. Under University of West Los Angeles: remove L. Saperston and B. Sloan signed an MOU. Add: an MOU with West Language Academy was signed last Friday, September 19, 2015. Replace Year Up with Verbum Dei.

2. Partnerships

- Charles R. Drew University of Medicine and Science is a private college with affordable tuition. King Drew is Medical School - they have upper division of a general science degree - has a certain health orientation to it. Could double their enrollment - about 600 students, could go up to 1200.
- Bridge to a Baccalaureate Planning Program is funded by NSF. Working with CSUDH to develop a planning grant proposal that will allow 18 months of funding to build a competitive plan for a full B2B proposal. Involve Computer Science, Mathematics and Science divisions. Primarily students who are already attending West. Proposal is due next week.
- Dept. of State Community College Initiative - State Dept. has a plan to bring students in on a J-1 VISA. At least a 3 school alliance to submit - four schools: Harbor, West, City and Trade. Total of 48 students; 12 at each of the schools, each student here at West for one year. Initial recruitment will be done by local assemblies and by local Fulbright people.
- Study Abroad - the college will offer four courses that we offer abroad: creative literature, business class in Costa Rica, and

The program will last 12-14 days. Most students are from West.

VISION - West: A gateway to success for every student.

West fosters a diverse learning community dedicated to student success.

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- **Global Studies** – now have all degree programs approved by curriculum and Senate and are on their way for approval by the Board and then on to Sacramento.

3. Submissions

Community College Pathway to Law School Initiative from State Bar of Calif. and Calif. LAW, a 501c3.

West does have agreements with Brandman and National where students from West can transfer to a BA program in law or legal studies.

4. Projections

Foundation – J. Coleman provided an update on the Gala. He has reached out to hotels to ask if it would be possible to postpone until late April or early May 2016. There was some hesitation from the Chancellor's Office that January 2016 would not be a good time due to the holidays.

Hospitality – B. Sloan reported on this program. West Adams Workforce Center is a training program to serve Veterans. There are a couple of training programs there. Inglewood Workforce Center is trying to get groups of 50 students in each class.

Film/TV rentals- Modern Family will be filming in the Library on Veteran's Day holiday in November.

Team Heal – high school athletic injuries

Project LEARN - Developing scholars programs to get students who are not high achievers to reach this level.

Foundation event – athletics - golf tournament - Monday, November 16, 2015 at Griffiths Park –posted on college website. There will be a dinner and a silent auction.

Progress on EMP from PIE Committee - J. Coleman reported on status of this.
