The Student Success Committee has merged with West's Student Equity, Access, and Completion (SEAC) Committee. The new Student Success Committee will continue to report to the Academic Senate and will also report to the College Council. New members of the Committee include the Vice President of Student Services and the chair of our Counseling Division.

The Committee also discussed next steps toward institutionalizing and fully funding West's Student Poster Showcase. Enrolling participants in an enhanced noncredit course this semester is being considered. Committee co-chairs are working with Allison Tom-Miura to finalize a plan.

Here is an update on West's three intervention strategies:

NAVIGATING WEST. The Guided Pathways Workgroup submitted the Self-Assessment in December 2017, and is working on the multi-year Work Plan due at the end of March 2018.

These documents are required for Guided Pathways funding. The Workgroup is engaging in mapping activities and strategies to the Four Pillars of Guided Pathways. The next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, March 7 at 3:00pm.

The Student Success Committee engaged in a robust discussion of the multiple College Promise initiatives that are and will be available to our students. Vice President Gonzalez is leading the effort to coordinate these efforts into a comprehensive First Year Experience program at West. Stay tuned for more.

ENHANCED TUTORING. The first meeting of the West's Learning Center Advisory Group is scheduled for Wednesday, February 28th in HLRC 112. The group will consult with representatives from 3CSN (California Community College Success Network) in response to the Student Success Committee's June recommendation to the president:

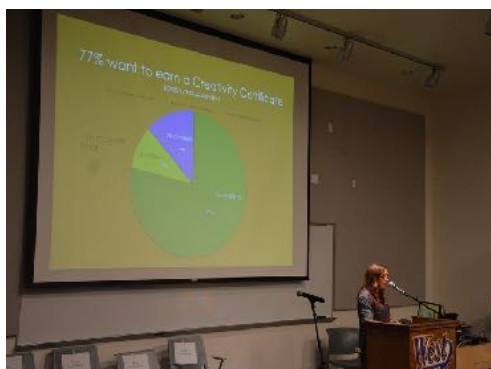
