NAVIGATING WEST. The Guided Pathways Workgroup culminated its work on West's Work Plan at its March 22nd meeting. (See photo above). Teams worked to develop the plan focused on Inquiry for the following seven Key Elements: Cross Functional Inquiry, Inclusive Decision-making, Improved Basic Skills, Guided Major and Career Exploration, Clear Program Requirements, Proactive and Integrated Supports, and Integrated Technology Infrastructure.

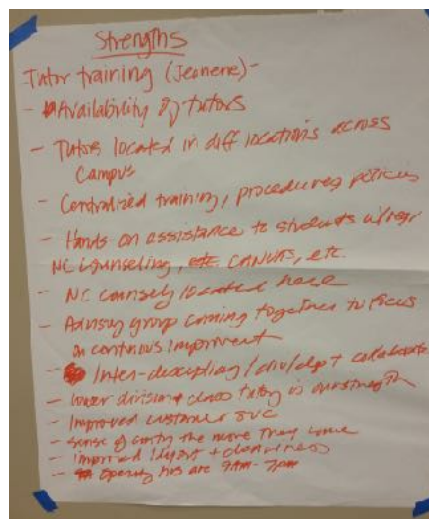
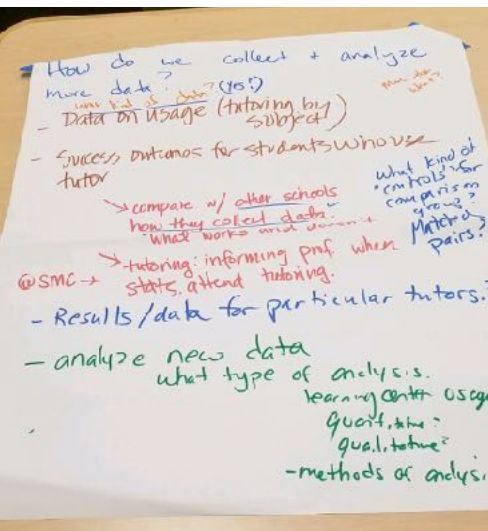
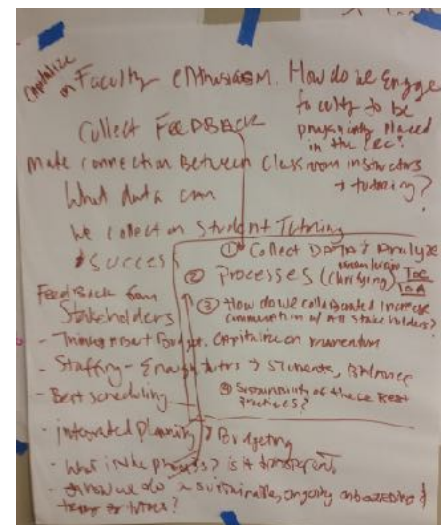
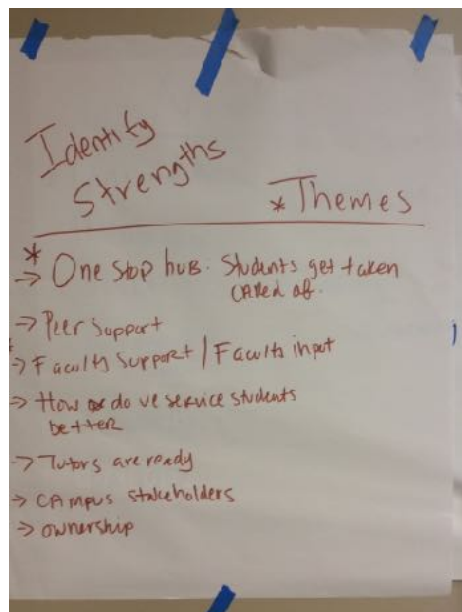
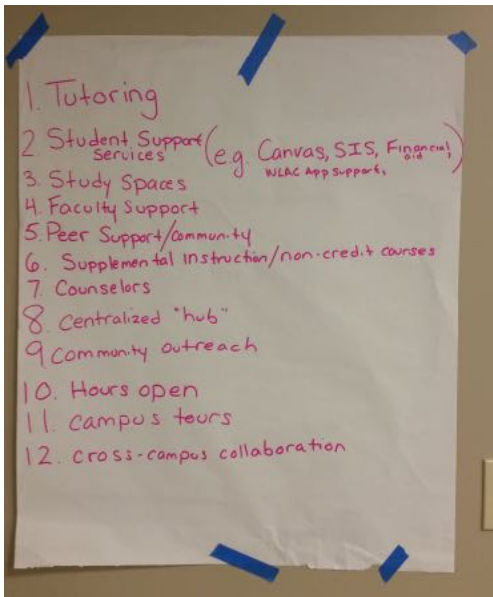
Keep an eye out for details about the other upcoming workshops.

West has been asked to facilitate a breakout session about our Professional Development offerings at the upcoming 3CSN Building Leadership Networks event at the Ventura Crown Plaza, April 20-21.

There are several groups on campus considering submitting applications to attend BSILI, 3CSN's Leadership Institute for Curricular and Institutional Transformation. There is discussion of a multi-college English team applying to attend and work on aligning courses to address AB705. There is also discussion of a West team applying to attend to work on West's Guided Pathways implementation.

ENHANCED TUTORING. West's Learning Center Advisory Group met on February 28th and again on March 21.
