



BECOME A DENTAL ASSISTANT



A Dental Assistant is a non-registered, technical worker who works under the direct supervision of a Dentist. Dental Assistants work in dental offices and throughout the community in healthcare events.

Job Growth & Demand: In California, an average of 700 new job openings per year is expected for Dental Assistants, plus an additional 940 job openings due to net replacement needs, resulting in a total of 1,640 job openings. Jobs for Dental Assistants are expected to increase by 15.5 percent, or 7,000 jobs between 2012 and 2022.

DENTAL ASSISTANT ASSOCIATE OF SCIENCE DEGREE or CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVMENT

Students interested in pursuing a career in Dental Assisting may enroll into the program planned to be offered in Fall Semester. All students are encouraged to visit the Assessment Center to have their Mathematic and English skills evaluated. All other students are required to take all courses and earn a grade of "C" or better to receive a Completion Certificate.

Pre-Requisites for the Dental Assisting Program:

- ✓ High School Diploma or Equivalent
- ✓ Assessment on English and Math at the college's assessment center

Student Eligibility and Requirements:

- Application to WLA College
- Application to Dental Assisting Program
- Clear Criminal Background check

COST:

If accepted into the Dental Assisting program there will be additional cost to enrollment in the Dental Assisting Program in addition to tuition, parking, health fees, etc., that include but not limited to:

- Instrument kits (Est. \$ 1300.)
- 3 sets of Uniforms (Est. \$ 75)
- Books (Est. \$700)
- Immunizations/Health Form requirements (est. \$126-442, depending on need)
- Licensing applications fees (Est. \$500)
- Background Check / HIPAA (Est. \$75)
- Livescan (Est. \$60)
- Misc. (Est. \$ 200). It is recommended that you apply for financial aid early
