A recent computer match between Selective Service and federal records failed to confirm that you have registered. Therefore you must provide written proof to our office that you have registered with Selective Service.

If you have **not** previously registered and are between the ages of 18 and 25, you can register on the web at [www.sss.gov](http://www.sss.gov). If you have previously registered, you can verify your registration online at [www.sss.gov](http://www.sss.gov). A printout from the online verification screen is acceptable documentation.

Students who entered the United States *after* their 26<sup>th</sup> birthday are exempt. Please bring in documentation (I-94 or passport) which clearly shows your date of birth and the date that you entered the United States.

If you did not register or cannot obtain written proof of your registration through the online verification web site, then you must contact Selective Service to resolve this matter before you can receive any financial aid (i.e., Federal Pell Grant, Federal SEOG, Federal Work-Study, Federal Direct/Stafford Student Loans or state Cal Grant). **You must obtain a Status Information letter from the Selective Service** (to include with your written statement below and any additional documentation you provide to support your explanation). ## Selective Service - Who Must Register

Does every young man have to register when he turns 18? Just about!

Almost all male U.S. Citizens regardless of where they live, and male immigrant aliens residing in the U.S., are required to be registered with Selective Service if they are at least 18 years old but are not 26 years old. Men who are 26 years old and older are too old to register. Some requirements are shown below:

Members of the National Guard or Reserves not on active duty	Yes

Men who separate from active duty military for any reason before they turn 26	Yes
Men rejected for enlistment for any reason before turning 26	Yes

Lawful non-immigrants on visas (e.g., diplomatic and consular personnel and families, foreign students, tourists with unexpired visas (Forms I-94, I-95A), or those with Border Crossing documents (Forms I-185, I-186, I-444)	No

<b>Note:</b> <i>Immigrants who did not enter the United States or maintained their lawful non-immigrant status by continually remaining on a valid visa until after they were 26 years old were never required to register. Also, immigrants born before 1960 who did not enter the United States or maintained their lawful non-immigrant status by continually remaining on a valid visa until after March 1975 were never required to register.</i>

Incarcerated, hospitalized, or institutionalized for medical reasons	No *
<b>► HANDICAPPED PHYSICALLY OR MENTALLY</b>	
Able to function in public with or without assistance	Yes
Continually confined to a residence, hospital, or institution	No
* <i>Must register within 30 days of release unless already age 26, already registered when released, or exempt during</i>	

*entire period age 18 through 25.*

\*\* *Residents of Puerto Rico, Guam, Virgin Islands, and Northern Mariana Islands are U.S. Citizens. Citizens of American Samoa are nationals and must register when their permanent address is in the U.S. This also goes for a national or citizen of the Republic of the Marshall Islands or the Federal States of Micronesia if they live in the U.S. for more than one year for any reason, except as a student or employee of the government of his homeland.*
