James M. Limbaugh

Dr. James M. (Jim) Limbaugh has served as the president of West Los Angeles College, a diverse urban dualpurpose college of 9,000 students, since October 2016. During his tenure, the College has been named an Aspen Institute Top 150 institution; established two baccalaureate degree programs (Dental Hygiene and Avionics), developed an associate's degree in Climate Change Studies, and created the California Center for Climate Change Education, prioritizing curricular enhancement, workforce development, and advocacy initiatives, with a focus on social justice. Recently, Dr. Limbaugh was also selected as one of only 25 presidents nationwide to be named an Aspen Institute Presidential Fellow.
